Why?

■ We all have a duty to care for the environment, and to reduce the impact of our operations and activities in order to preserve the environmental balance that sustain life. A great deal can be done to conserve finite resources and reduce climate warming by reducing the amount we use, re-using material when we can and reducing waste whenever possible

Do





- ✓ Use recycle bins
- Turn off lights and other equipment when not in use
- ✓ Reduce non-essential heating
- Keep generators and boilers properly maintained
- ✓ Report any poor environmental conditions
- Comply with all waste management processes
- Reduce any noise levels where possible (e.g. fit acoustic hoods)
- ✓ Install insulation to reduce heat loss
- ✓ Turn down thermostats
- Reduce water consumption

Don't



- Leave lights or other electrical appliances on when not in use
- Put hazardous materials (waste oil etc) down drains, sinks and toilets
- Tamper with or open discharge valves on vessels containing hazardous materials
- Put waste in the wrong bin
- Leave taps running
