Trip injuries from obstructions or uneven surfaces and poor lighting

Safe System of Work

- 1. You must wear reinforced toe cap safety shoes, a high-vis vest or jacket and cut-resistant gloves (minimum EN388).
- 2. Ensure you have been trained and are familiar with the door-opening and locking mechanism.
- 3. The area around the container must be kept clean and tidy.
- 4. Before opening the door, check the area is completely clear to prevent collision with pedestrians, vehicles and other objects.
- 5. When entering the container, check the path is clear and be aware of changes in floor levels.
- 6. Carry items so that you can clearly see your pathway.
- 7. Load items safely, leaving the access route from the door clear.
- 8. Heavy or awkward items must be moved by two people.
- 9. Where heavy items are moved by tug, hand pallet or forklift, this must be done by a trained operator.
- 10. Check the route for oncoming traffic and stop traffic until the tug, hand pallet or forklift has left the area.
- 11. Always check that everyone has left the container before closing the door.
- 12. Keep hands away from the main engagement point on the bolt when shutting the door.
- 13. Report any damage and rust on locks and hinges, as this increases the force required to operate the door.
- 14. Ensure that only the permitted types of waste are placed into the relevant skips. Do not mix waste if the type is stated.

If you have any concerns, stop and speak with your line manager before proceeding.
