

## HAZARD OBSERVATIONS



## IDENTIFYING AND REPORTING HAZARDS BEFORE THEY RESULT IN INCIDENTS ENSURES OUR TEAM MEMBERS ARE NOT UNNECESSARILY INJURED.

Recently there have been several incidents where, if an **identified** hazard had been **reported**, it could have been **resolved** and our team members would have not been injured.

## What can you do?

- Proactively check your work area and surroundings (internal and external) for hazards. Completing regular Safety Walks will help you identify these on a regular basis.
- 2. If you can, remove the hazard, or at least make the area safe. Failing that, mark the hazard so others can see it too.
- 3. Speak out and make those in the area aware of the hazard.
- 4. Report it to your supervisor or line manager Remember Hazard Observations and Near Misses must be reported on AIR3.
- 5. If you have reported something, own it and follow it up until action has being taken don't be discouraged.
