Document binding machines

Safe System of Work

- 1. When using a portable binding machine, make sure it is positioned on a flat and stable surface, with adequate lighting and workspace.
- 2. Check that the binding machine is fitted with all necessary safety guards and that they are in good working order.
- 3. Keep clothing, hair, lanyards and jewellery away from moving parts so they cannot become entrapped in the mechanism.
- 4. Clear the waste tray regularly and make sure it is correctly refitted.
- 5. Remove any staples, paper clips or other metal items before inserting objects into the machine.
- 6. Do not exceed the document capacity and overload the binding machine.
- 7. If using a manually operated binding machine for prolonged periods, take regular breaks.
