### Safe System of Work

- 1. You must wear waterproof clothing (high visibility as appropriate) and waterproof footwear.
- 2. Wear a face shield or goggles when using a pressure washer.
- 3. Check that there is no risk of run-off entering surface water drains and contaminating water systems (or confirm that there is a local council certificate permitting run-off into drain system) or creating slip hazards.
- 4. Do not carry out the task when the temperature is low and run-off could freeze.
- 5. Erect warning signage before starting, and where appropriate, use barriers and signage to prevent unauthorised access.
- 6. Check the area is clear before tipping the bin.
- 7. Tip the bin carefully onto its back, while holding the lid closed. This must always done as a team of two.
- 8. Remove any large debris from the bin with a litter picker before washing the bin.
- 9. Wash the bin with a hose or pressure washer, removing all debris from inside the bin.
- 10. When finished, turn the hose or pressure washer off.
- 11. Return the washer to its usual place of storage and tidy up any hoses.
- 12. After checking the area, carefully return the bin to the upright position. This must always be done as a team of two.
- 13. Check there is no leakage from the bin before returning it.
- 14. Remove gloves and wash your hands after completing the task.

If you have any concerns, stop and speak with your line manager before proceeding.
