## **Rotary drop safes**

### Safe System of Work

#### When using the rotary drop door:

- 1. Ensure that the item being deposited is fully inserted in the compartment.
- 2. Do not overfill the compartment and or attempt to squeeze items in.
- 3. Keep hands away from the rotary drop door to prevent them from becoming trapped.
- 4. Pull handle slowly towards you and continue to hold the handle.
- 5. When the item has dropped, slowly move the rotary drop door back to the original position.

#### When opening and closing the main compartment:

- 1. Ensure there is sufficient space for the door to open fully, without making contact with your body.
- 2. Open the door slowly.
- 3. Keep hands away from the safe opening and slowly close the door.

If you have any concerns, stop and speak with your line manager before proceeding.
