What are the hazards and how might they harm?





Ignition of overheated

food or other

flammable items

Burns/scalds from contact with flame, hot surfaces, equipment or food



Explosion or fire associated with use of gas

Use of blowtorches

Safe System of Work

- 1. Never use the blowtorch if it is leaking gas or malfunctioning.
- 2. Hold the blowtorch in an upright position when lighting it.
- 3. Ensure that you are ready to light the flame as soon as the gas is turned on.
- 4. Only use the blowtorch in a well-ventilated area.
- 5. Use the blowtorch away from flammable materials.
- 6. Always hold the blowtorch by the handle if it has one.
- 7. Ensure that food being seared is placed on a non-flammable surface, such as a metal tray.
- 8. Do not hold the container of food being seared in your hand.
- 9. Never put the blowtorch down on or near to a hot surface or ignition source.
- 10. Always put the blowtorch down on a level surface.
- 11. Never leave the blowtorch unattended when lit.
- 12. Always fit and change gas cartridges or refill the gas chamber in a well-ventilated area, away from any naked flames and, where practicable, outside in the open air
- 13. Do not use the blowtorch for prolonged periods turn it off after 30 minutes and allow it to cool before relighting it.
- 14. Do not use the blowtorch to light ovens, grills etc.

15. Ensure that the gas control knob is fully turned off after use.

Use of blowtorches continued

- After use allow all hot parts to cool and then store immediately in a secure, well-ventilated place below 50°C, out of direct sunlight and at least one metre away from any flammable materials and ignition sources.
- 17. Blowtorches with removable gas canisters should have the canister removed prior to storage to reduce the risk of leakage.
- 18. Never attempt to repair or modify the blowtorch.
