ARE WE COMPLIANT WITH OUR STATUTORY COMPLIANCE?

We have a duty of care to our teams to ensure that all statutory compliance is being completed in line with legislative requirements, this includes Gas, Electrical, Pressure Systems, Lifts and Lifting Equipment, Extract and Ventilation, Fire, Water, Asbestos and Air Conditioning Systems.

The key document that must be completed in unit by the unit management is the Work Premises: Statutory Compliance Declaration. This document is located within the Additional Health and Safety Documents Section of the Workplace Safety Management System Folder or alternatively is available on the HSE Website by clicking here: [WSMS](#)

This document must be completed and reviewed annually to ensure there are no changes to either duty holders or documentation reference locations. The "Duty holder" is the person responsible for ensuring the inspections and testing is completed in line with the legislative requirements.

You must ensure that the document is completed and signed by all identified duty holders, in some cases Compass will be the duty holder and in others the "Client" will be the duty holder. Once agreed and at what time frames the reinspecting is required, you should complete the HSE Activity Calendar with the relevant dates to ensure you plan in the annual reviews.

Please ensure that you share the Safety Conversation on Statutory Compliance with your unit management team and any other applicable team members.

WSMS UPDATE - LEISURE SERVICES



New content available on the HSE Website for units with Gyms, Tennis Courts or Swimming Pools.

We have now completed the new Leisure Services Health & Safety documentation, including a comprehensive Leisure Services Risk Assessment, new Safety Task Cards, and supporting checklists.

These documents must be implemented at all venues operating gyms, swimming pools, or tennis courts. Please review the documentation against your local operations to ensure all leisure activities are adequately covered.

If your venue has leisure facilities not included within the risk assessment, or tasks that are not covered by the existing Safety Task Cards, please contact your HSE Sector Lead who will provide support and guidance.

CYCLE TO WORK DAY - THURSDAY 6TH AUGUST

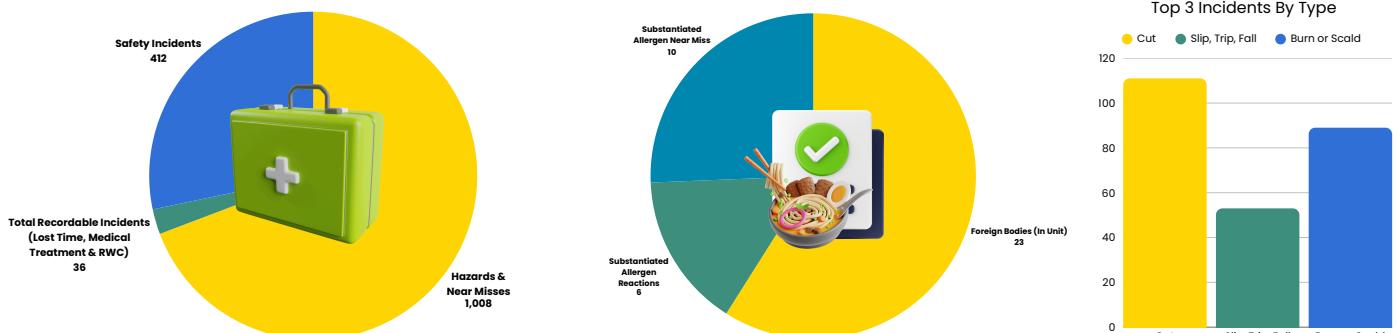
Did you know that Thursday, 6th August was cycle to work day? In fact, many of us are choosing to cycle as part of our daily routine over driving due to rising fuel prices. With those two things in mind here some tips for both cycling safely. If you would like more information, why not visit [THINK.gov.uk](#) or [RSA Cycle Safety](#).

1. Ride decisively, keeping at least 0.5 meters away from the kerb edge.
2. Before turning, stopping etc., look and clearly signal to show drivers what you plan to do; make eye contact where possible.
3. Always use lights after dark, but also at dusk and dawn, or when visibility is poor. Light-coloured or fluorescent clothing can also help other road users see you in daylight and poor light.
4. Wear a correctly fitted cycle helmet that is securely fastened.
5. Take care when passing parked vehicles, leaving enough room (a door's width or 1 meter) to avoid being hit if a car door is opened.

Advice for motorist, remember to allow the cyclist space on the road, stay alert and continually scan for hazards. Use your mirrors to gather as complete a picture of the road.
