



## HAZARD OBSERVATIONS



### **IDENTIFYING AND REPORTING HAZARDS BEFORE THEY RESULT IN INCIDENTS ENSURES OUR TEAM MEMBERS ARE NOT UNNECESSARILY INJURED.**

Recently there have been several incidents where, if an **identified** hazard had been **reported**, it could have been **resolved** and our team members would have not been injured.

#### **What can you do?**

1. Proactively check your work area and surroundings (internal and external) for hazards. Completing regular Safety Walks will help you identify these on a regular basis.
2. If you can, remove the hazard, or at least make the area safe. Failing that, mark the hazard so others can see it too.
3. Speak out and make those in the area aware of the hazard.
4. Report it to your supervisor or line manager – Remember Hazard Observations and Near Misses must be reported on AIR3.
5. If you have reported something, own it and follow it up until action has being taken – don't be discouraged.
